Exchange commodity, the world's solution to the problems of the agricultural field

Economics expert Pourabbasi said that the world has come up with solutions to the problems in terms of agricultural commodity prices, including the World Trade Organization, the World Grain & Grocery Organization.

When the market is competitive, the market mechanism determines what the price of wheat should be. The predicted mechanism in this field is to submit agricultural products including wheat in exchange of a commodity, which in addition to bringing price of wheat to its actual rate, it takes the financial burden off the government.

The supply of agricultural products in exchange of commodity, on one hand, private sector enters and on the other hand, chains are formed and the government instead of involving itself with all the farmers takes actions to create policies in the field of agricultural products, especially wheat.

to solving the  
problems in this field, by the supply of agricultural products  
on the stock  
exchange, we will witness transparency in the pricing of  
products, as well as the  
realization of the price of products, especially wheat.

This professor, emphasizing that the barriers for wheat entry  
to  
Commodity should be removed for realizing the price of this  
product and taking the  
burden off the government, said that the State has considered  
8145 billion  
Tomans in the budget this year for purchasing wheat, which  
this figure was 5000  
billion Tomans last year. Therefore our procedure for pricing  
the rates of  
wheat is not correct and we should move forward like the other  
countries in the  
world by submitting our agricultural products especially wheat  
to the commodity  
exchange and taking advantage of this for the state and  
farmers.
